

## PRIVACY INFORMATION UNDER EU REGULATION 2016/679

Regulation EU 2016/679 (hereafter “GDPR”) and other Italian legislation (including Legislative Decree 196/2003, hereafter “*Personal Data Protection Code*” or “*Privacy Code*”) and regulatory measures are there to protect the confidentiality of personal data, imposing a series of obligations on those who process the personal data of *natural persons*, otherwise known as *interested persons*. One of the most important legal requirements set out in the GDPR is the duty to ensure that data subjects have been informed on this subject and, when there are legal bases, to obtain their permission to process their personal data.

It being understood that all personal data processing operations carried out by MIP are based on the principles of lawfulness, correctness and transparency, of minimising and limiting the data stored and their correctness, integrity and confidentiality, we provide the following information:

- a) The Data Controller is **MIP Politecnico di Milano – Graduate School of Business Consortium Company with Share Capital**, Via Lambruschini 4C – Building 26/A, 20156 Milan, Italy, Tel.: +39 02 23992820, Fax: +39 02 23992844.
- b) MIP has appointed a Data Protection Officer (**DPO**), domiciled at the Data Controller’s address in compliance with the relevant regulation on the handling of personal data. Contact details for the DPO are: *Telephone: +39.02.23992820 - email: dpo@mip.polimi.it*
- c) Data supplied or acquired from third parties are handled lawfully according to the relative legal basis and for the sole purposes set out in the table below:

The information supplied will be preserved in paper and/or electronic format and be processed manually and/or electronically or by automated means in general.

Data related to data Subject are retained in the database until consent is withdrawn and for profiling will be processed for five years.

- d) Participants can voluntarily withhold their consent however, this may result in them being unable to be contacted and kept up to date with information via newsletters and/or emails;
- e) Whereas communicating personal data to third parties does not exempt the latter from supplying this privacy information or from lawfully handling the data exclusively when there is a valid legal basis, we nevertheless specify that, apart from the communications to persons whose right to access such information is recognised in law and/or by an order from the Personal Data Protection Authorities, the information may be communicated to: Politecnico di Milano; possible partners involved in realising the training programmes; insurance companies and brokerage firms and their technical experts.

- f) Personal data may be handled by persons qualified as being responsible for handling such data, under Articles 4.8 and 28 of the GDPR (professionals, lawyers, consultancy and service companies, hardware and software support companies...) and by people authorised to process data under Article 29, who operate under the direct authority of the Data Controller (employees or collaborators under whatsoever basis), where the latter has provided relative instructions.
- g) Data can be transferred to a third country only in the event that the country satisfies a high standard of protection of personal data and where the Personal Data Protection Authorities have determined this to be of a suitable level.
- h) Making the request through the DPO, you can exercise your rights at any moment under Articles 15 to 22 of the GDPR, that is, your right to ask the Data Controller for access to personal data and to rectify or cancel them or limit the processing that concerns them or to oppose their processing.  
As an interested person, you can revoke your consent in any moment, but this does not affect the lawfulness of data handled before the revocation.  
As an interested person, you can lodge a complaint with the Personal Data Protection authorities.
- i) MIP uses a profiling system with the objective to improve communication effectiveness, allowing the interested person to obtain information that respects their interests more closely.
